A Really Special Language: 'Royal Navy Speak'

Many organisations have their own insider language/slang. The Royal Navy (RN)'s slang is as good as it gets.

The slang travelled the world gathering inputs from the likes of the then exotic, now terribly dull, ports in countries like Gibraltar, Hong Kong, Kenya, Malta, Mombasa, Singapore, and Sri Lanka. The table below shows the different languages between RN speak and how a civvy ('civilian') might speak.

With a few differences and unique words, the RN's sister Navies - Royal Canadian Navy, Royal Australian Navy, Royal New Zealand Navy, and South African Navy spoke – and still speak – a similar dialect to the RN as part of the Commonwealth Navy bonds that still bind today. When we meet any of these Navies, we have instant connection. Of course, it helps we shared a serious love of alcohol and would laugh at each other's killer sea stories.

Other Navies - notably the US Navy (USN) - have their own Navy slang. What surprises me is that the USN slang has little commonality to the RN and is quite a bit more profane, crude, graphic, and not very funny. Maybe George Washington gave the orders to filthy up the RN slang after the war ended.

Being at sea for all those 100s of years gave matelots (sailors) too much dead time. Way too much 140° proof pusser's rum time facilitated those matelots developing a descriptive language, which goes back 400 years and is totally intertwined with the Royal Navy's traditions.

I used this language as a Midshipman when HMS Bronington nick-named me 'Sid the Mid', and when HMS Cleopatra nick-named me 'Danny (Fisher)' – after Harold Robbins' novel "A Stone for Danny Fisher". Both times, I was the only officer playing football with my sailor shipmates and as a result, both times making me the recipient of a wet, gulpers, or sippers of firewater 140° proof grog Pussers rum.

My absolute favourite RN slang is "It is cold enough to freeze the balls off a brass monkey" - for short "Brass Monkeys" = really cold. Right on the gun deck by the cannons of a sail warship sat a brass square, with round indentations, known as a 'brass monkey'. On top of the monkey was balanced a square pyramid of cannonballs three high ready to be loaded and fired. When it got really cold, the brass contracted, and the cannonballs would roll off the monkey. You may have to agree that having one's sailors chasing their balls all over the gun deck would be funny.

The following are common examples of the slang I spoke (selectively) in the Royal Navy. I say selectively because there is much left out that is very coarse and too graphic.

OK, this is enough chiff chaff. Let us cut to the chase (wherever that is).
